Frequently Asked Questions:

Why do I need to give my social security #?

The State Fair is the one who will be issuing the checks should you place. The checks will be distributed via mail, not the day of the show. They won't issue them without a social security number. If you don't feel comfortable listing your # on the form, that's fine. But, the day of the show you will need to provide that info. If you forget, and place, you will not get paid. This will be your responsibility as NBHA NY 07 will not chase you down.

How can I qualify for the Coliseum run?

There is a \$500.00 added barrel race, sponsored by the NYS Fair, held Saturday night Aug. 28, 2010 in the coliseum. This run is directly after their day show has ended. The entries come from the NBHA barrel race. We "invite" the top five riders from each division of the open run to go to the coliseum. We also invite the top three riders in each division from the youth go and the top two riders in each division from the senior go. If a rider chooses not to go, then we will "bump down" to the next rider until all 40 spots are filled to compete at the coliseum. This NYS Fair Coliseum run was paid in the 3D/4D format last year.

What do I need to do when I arrive at the fairgrounds?

All horse trailers should enter through Gate 7. At the gate, you will receive an admission ticket (for each rider) and trailer tag for the grounds (RV tag as well if you have a RV spot). You will then go to the vet check (you will need to have Rabies and Coggins papers, and a health certificate if you are from out of state). The vet will give you a form showing your horse(s) have been checked. You will need to bring that form to the office when you check in. After you park, you should come to the office and check in. We will have a list of stalls showing where your horses will go. At that time, we can answer any questions or concerns you may have, or take any late entries. The office will be open on Friday 8/27 from 6 pm – 10 pm and Saturday morning starting at 7 am. If you have a problem outside of that time frame, please call the district director (Amy Galway - NBHA NY07 Director) at 315-264-6840.

What time will stalls be available Friday night, and when do I have to be out on Sunday?

There is a show on Friday and other horses will be using the stalls. They are "supposed" to be out by 6pm. It doesn't always work out that way and there is no guarantee your stall will be clean. On Friday, when the show management arrives, we will be checking the stalls to see who is still there, when they're leaving, and then we will label the stalls. The district director (Amy Galway) will have a stall list with her and there will be one posted at the office. Horses should be out of the stalls by 9am Sunday morning. You do not need to clean your stalls, but it is appreciated.

What do I need to bring?

- All horses on the fairgrounds are required to have a stall. These stalls are not pre-bedded (but might have "leftovers" from the prior occupant). You should bring your own bedding or you can purchase it at the fairgrounds.
- Rabies and Coggins within the calendar year. Your horse will not be allowed on the grounds without them.
- NBHA Card. We need to verify membership. If you don't have it, you pay the \$10 non-member fee. NO EXCEPTIONS.
